Ideas for ways to access supplies

- Hygiene or cold weather supply drives outside stores.
- Americorps teams could help with this.
- Asking for donations directly from stores and organizations.
- Utilize VFW for funding/resource drives.
- Chamber of Commerce next meeting November 1, need to get on schedule.
- Request through Buy Nothing groups on Facebook.
- Tacoma Comedy Club drive.
- LEC could utilize 501(c)3 status to secure supplies.
- SSVF (veterans' services) team will do outreach/distribution.
- HOPE Team works 7 days/week, happy to hand out needed supplies. Located off of Ruston. Have case manager who could pick up and store.
- Use social media to engage folks to donate supplies.
- Re-connect with Superior Linens to get blankets again.
- Amazon Wish Lists.
- Need a long-term plan for narrative of those with out homes or shelter to increase empathy.
- City and County Councils have lucrative salaries and perks and could easily contribute towards large amounts of needed supplies. Have them use their position to contact manufacturers of hand warmers to get a large donation.
- Storage needed for larger donation distribution.

Things that help during cold weather

- Warming station in the middle of the night when it is the coldest.
- Always huge demand for cold weather resources like coats, blankets, tarps, etc.
- Hot water bottles for warmth
- Gift cards are a way to give people flexibility on meeting needs.
- Waterproof sleeping bags
- A lot of enthusiasm for a blanket recycling project that pulls wet gear out of camps, washes, drys, and redistributes. Maybe somewhere with industrial equipment could help.
