What Works

- Tacoma Reads and giving folks A Place Called Home was helpful and powerful, potent for people who don't know anything about homelessness.
- More people have strong opinions have this than about almost anything.
- I often use the same skills that I use for crisis de-escalation, as well as, "yes, and" language.

- I've faced people angry at me for outreach work and been able to lower the temperature and have constructive conversations.
- I have stats that help, such as about misconceptions regarding age, mental illness, drug
 use.
- I do ask if people are willing to hear information. I feel that many people are willing to hear about this topic. But haters are going to hate, of course.
- Often, when in a group or with a friend, I'll bring this up and ask how people feel about homelessness. I share real stories of real people. Usually, they don't match the paradigm that folks hear on the news. This encourages me.
- Making a commitment to engage with publicly elected officials makes it possible to not be silent about this. This is an ongoing challenge.
- I think it's such a complex issue with huge impacts that folks don't understand, like about families that are homeless, kids.
- Elevating empathy is so important. When I go out with mobile outreach, I talk about how expensive everything is and how easy it would be to fall into homelessness.
- Lead with empathy and then tie back to upstream, systemic things that can help us all.
- Don't don't try to paint unhoused folks as 100% innocent, acknowledge property damage etc, and then talk about how we need to address the higher-level structural issues to help us ALL.
- Engage with folks who are on the fence, low information, but open to conversation; don't waste too much time with folks who have their heels 'dug in'

And Does Not Work

- There's so much negativity around this topic. Folks will repeat old/outdated/inaccurate information.
- People in the faith community give items like clothing and food but don't have enough exposure to actually folks with lived experience, that would help them to understand the issue on a a deeper level
