WHAT IS THE HOMELESS PIT COUNT?

The Homeless Point-In-Time (PIT) count is an unduplicated count on a single night of people in the community experiencing homelessness. These counts help communities plan services and programs to address local needs, measure progress in decreasing homelessness, and identify strengths and gaps in the current homeless crisis response system.

HOW CAN I VOLUNTEER?

Volunteers may participate by organizing donations or surveying individuals experiencing homelessness. Volunteers must be 18 years of age, have access to a smart phone or tablet, and attend a PIT count training. Volunteers may sign up online at www.piercecountywa.gov/PIT



Donations are given out during the PIT count. We need socks, hats, gloves, hand/foot warmers, warm blankets, packaged food, and hygiene kits including shampoo, conditioner, soap, razor, deodorant, and feminine products.
