It is critical that we are able to convey that an investment in behavioral health services and resources *across Pierce County* is wanted and needed. It will cost an average of \$19.35 per person per year. This would have raised \$13.1 million in 2019. We know we have a regressive tax system that can only be fixed through the State Legislature. But we also know we are not saving any money by *not* having the tax. With a tax, we are able to have transparency and accountability for how the dollars are spent and most importantly, increase access, coordination, collaboration, education, and so much more for all who live, work, and enjoy Pierce County.

The ordinance will have a first and final reading before the Pierce County Human Services Committee on **9:30 AM - 11 AM on Feb 18, 2020**. This will be at the County City Building (Room 1045, 930 Tacoma Ave S, Tacoma, WA 98402). **Supporters are encouraged to provide a 3 minute testimonial. Public testimonial is extremely helpful at this stage**.

Once the ordinance is out of committee, it will then go before the full County Council. A super majority vote is needed which means at least 5 of the 7 Council Members will need to vote aye/yes for the tax to pass. The final vote will take place at the <u>March 10</u> Council Meeting at <u>3</u> <u>PM at the County City Building(Room 1045, 930 Tacoma Ave S, Tacoma, WA 98402).</u> Public testimony will be heard. Supporters are encouraged to provide testimony.
