

# High Winds possible Coast and Northwest Interior Tuesday. Wet Weather continues into Tuesday.

### **KEY POINTS**

- Weather system Tuesday with high winds likely along the coast beginning around 7 am and continuing through mid afternoon and over Western Whatcom, Western Skagit, San Juan and Island county plus the Admiralty Inlet area beginning around 10 am through the afternoon hours. Southerly winds 25 to 40 mph with gusts to 60 mph.
- Outside of the warning areas winds 15 to 30 mph with gusts to 40 mph Tuesday.
- Flooding possible on the Skokomish river late tonight/Tuesday morning and again late Tuesday night/Wednesday morning.
