# REVENUE FOR HOUSING FAQs

To reduce and stop homelessness, Pierce County needs a housing plan that provides for attainable housing for moderate, low- and very-low income residents, permanent supportive housing & shelter capacity for all who need it

### **Homelessness in Pierce County**

- 12,237 people experienced homelessness in Pierce County during 2020
  - 43% female
  - 43% members of families with children
  - 7% veterans

- 7% unaccompanied youth or young adults
- There were also 5,580 students in the Pierce County School system homeless in 2018-2019 (2020 data not yet available)
- Reasons for Homelessness (2020 year to date):

36% from employment/housing10% Job loss

- 10% Un- or underemployment
- 16% No affordable housing
- 20% Domestic Violence Victim
- 9% Eviction
- 18% Family Crisis/Breakup
  - 7% Other
- 6% Health and Safety
- 3% Mental Health
- 3% Medical Condition
  - 4% Substance Abuse
- Providing housing is less expensive than homelessness

- RCW 82.14.530 allows the county to approve 1/10 of one percent sales tax to provide a steady stream of income, \$18-20 million/year
- There are currently 850 units of supportive housing; 2,300 more are needed

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### What is affordable housing?

Affordable housing is housing for which the cost can be covered by no more than 30% of the individual's income, needed especially for people whose income is at 60% of area median income or below
