#### **BRIEF SUMMARY:**

Increases various jail incarceration rates for 2022 and 2023:

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The Pierce County Corrections Bureau provides misdemeanant jail-services for other local governments, charging rates first codified in 2016 that must be reviewed each biennium. Rates are set using formulas to recoup the costs of incarceration.
