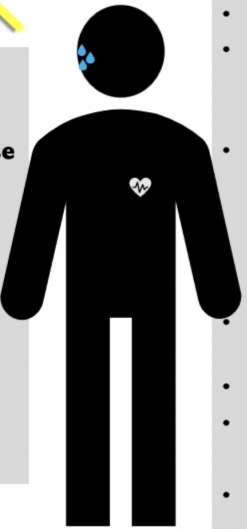

Know the Symptoms

Heat Exhaustion	Heat Stroke
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Feeling faint or dizzy • Rapid weak pulse • Nausea • Excessive sweating • Cool, pale, clammy skin • Weakness • Muscle cramps 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Confusion • Throbbing headache • Rapid strong pulse • Nausea, vomiting • Body temperature >103 • Red, hot, dry skin • No sweating • Might lose consciousness

Cooling Stations

Tacoma Public Libraries and Pierce County Public Libraries are open during regular business hours for cooling.

Brotherhood RISE (2136 Martin Luther King Jr. Way in Tacoma) is open from Noon to 9 p.m. each day and also offers water.

Lighthouse Activity Center (5016 A St. in Tacoma) is open to anyone in the community beginning 7/26 for cooling and water, 8:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m.

Beacon Center (415 S. 13th St.) is open for seniors 60+ Monday and Tuesday

Trinity Presbyterian (1619 Sixth Ave in Tacoma) is open 3-6 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday

Key Peninsula Civic Center is open daily from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., with water available.

Chapel Hill Church (7700 Skansie Ave NW, Gig Harbor) lobby is open 12:30-8:30 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday (enter Door D)

PETS ARE IN DANGER TOO

If it's too warm in a car a dog can suffer heat stroke in as little as 10 minutes, which can lead to seizures and death. Some warning signs to look out for are panting, drooling, vomiting, dizziness and red gums. What to do -- get them out of the heat and douse their paws with water.
