

Cold Weather This Weekend Into Next Week


Next Update by 4:00 PM, Friday, January 27, 2023

KEY POINTS

- Cold temperatures this weekend through next week.
- Strong, gusty Fraser River outflow winds expected Saturday and Sunday.
- Light lowland snowfall possible Saturday night and Sunday morning.

WEATHER RISK OUTLOOK

Risk levels incorporate potential impacts from weather hazards and likelihood of occurrence.

| Western Washington | |

| * Cold | Impacts: Cold temperatures may impact vulnerable populations such as the homeless and those without adequate access to heating. Sensitive crops/plants may be damaged. Timing: Sunday through much of next week. |
| | Low temperatures in the 20s with highs in the 30s. |
| 릉 Wind | Impacts: Gusty winds may cause localized power outages and tree limb damage. Temporary structures could be damaged. |
| | N/NE Fraser River outflow winds peaking Saturday night and early Sunday morning. |
| * Snow | Impacts: Light lowland snow accumulations on grassy or elevated surfaces including bridges, overpasses, and secondary roadways. Little impactful snow accumulation expected on primary roadways. Timing: Saturday night through early Sunday morning. |

• Thursday-Friday

• Significant or impactful weather not expected.

• Saturday-Sunday

- Strong, gusty, north to northeast Fraser River outflow winds up to 30-40 mph (peaking Saturday night and early Sunday morning).
 - Strongest winds over western Whatcom, San Juans, Strait of Juan de Fuca and North Coast.

- Light lowland snowfall possible Saturday night and early Sunday morning. Widespread/significant accumulations not expected. See graphic for details.
- Cold low temperatures in the 20s Sunday morning with highs in the 30s.
- Monday-Wednesday
 - Cold but mostly dry.
 - Low temperatures in the 20s each morning with highs in the 30s.
 - Light lowland snowfall possible at times from Monday night through Wednesday but significant accumulations not expected (10-20% chance of greater than 0.1" snowfall).
