
When the COVID-19 global pandemic reached Austin, protecting our most vulnerable neighbors became our top priority. We needed your help to continue serving our homeless and formerly homeless neighbors, and you answered our call in a big way! During the health crisis, you provided the resources necessary to keep our neighbors safe in Community First! Village, and also ensured that those men and women still suffering on the streets received food and basic necessities. Even in the midst of the uncertainty of the pandemic and the economic crisis, we remained certain we could count on you. Because of you, progress on Phase 2 of Community First! Village continued and we moved 41 homeless neighbors off the streets into a permanent home within a caring community. Additionally, Community First! Village will be expanding across an additional 127 acres with room for up to 1400 more homes.

Our community has relied on us for more than two decades, and we need to be here—today and tomorrow—to care for the most vulnerable in our city. You are essential to ensuring that we protect that future.

As an adventure-seeker, Tim lived many of his years for the thrill of a challenge. Among those challenges, however, was his use and distribution of drugs. Tim spent years in and out of prison while carrying the destructive weight of a drug addiction, which led to a downward spiral with his health and eventual loss of relationships with his family. With nowhere to turn after losing his job, Tim found himself homeless on the streets of Austin. He has been living in Community First! Village for more than four years, and recently completed 30 years of parole.

Cheryl is from Houston, Texas and grew up with her hard-working parents and 13 brothers and sisters. She has been part of the Mobile Loaves & Fishes family for more than four years. When her husband passed away, Cheryl was devastated, lost and hopeless. Through her struggles with addiction and this loss of family, Cheryl found hope in her Community First! family, and ultimately by surrendering herself to God to live the life He has paved for her. Although Cheryl briefly tried reconnecting with her son and grandchildren, she has returned to her forever home and supportive community in the Village.

A young boy with the dream of one day becoming a rockstar, Lee has been in and out of bands and playing his guitar for more than 40 years. The day Lee remembers most from his journey, however, is a July day in 2015 when he lost it all. His car, his home and his hope—all gone. After living on the streets and in shelters, Lee had a hard time adjusting to the place he now calls home in Community First! Village. But even through the trials that life has thrown his way, Lee says he has learned the true meaning of community. Following a recent serious accident and a challenging recovery, Lee believes he was saved by his faith and his newfound community.

Raised as one of 11 children in a sharecropper's family in Mississippi, Dexter encountered a literal life-changing storm when he was only seven years old. Several years after his mother passed away, he dropped out of school, and as a teenager found himself on a path of crime and drugs. Dexter was in prison by the age of 17, and eventually wound up homeless on the streets of Austin for two decades. As a neighbor in Community First! Village for more than three years, he takes pride in defending his new neighborhood as a place that has him closer to the path he desires in life.


