

## The Tacoma Pierce County Coalition to End Homelessness

We are a network of individuals, non-profit organizations, government agencies, faith communities, and community businesses working together to serve people experiencing homelessness. Our end goal is to help folks establish safe housing as quickly as possible and help them to retain that housing so their homeless episode is short and never repeated. We also work to address many of the factors that drive homelessness.

What the Coalition Does We bring our voices to public policy debates, and advocate for the right to housing throughout Pierce County. We gather weekly from 9 - 11 a.m. on Fridays (currently virtually by Zoom), to learn about resources for community members living homeless or at risk of homelessness and to coordinate efforts. Aware of the disproportionate effects of homelessness on marginalized communities, we work to center the voices of those with lived experience when advocating solutions.
